Redford Union High School provides a quality education to approximately 700 students grades 9-12. Our student body is represented by 75% African-American students, 17% Caucasian students, 8% Hispanic American students and other ethnicities. Redford Union High School has a successful Early College and Careers program and is partnered with WCCC and Wayne-RESA, respectively. Our Early College Program currently provides opportunities for 79 students spread out across four cohorts. Redford Union High School is also extremely proud of its partnership with the Anti-Defamation League to ensure that all students and staff are trained in cultural proficiency
