

HURON INTERMEDIATE SCHOOL DISTRICT

The Board of Education for Huron Intermediate School District is in search of a new superintendent.

Huron County has seven K-12 school districts including Bad Axe, Elkton-Pigeon-Bay Port Lakers, Ubly, Harbor Beach, North Huron, Caseville and Owendale-Gagetown. There are five K-8 school districts: Eccles, Adams, Verona Mills, Big Burning and Church. The county's four parochial schools: Our Lady of Lake Huron, Zion Lutheran, Cross Lutheran and St. John's Lutheran round out the excellent educational opportunities available to the approximately 4,000 students in Huron County.

Huron ISD, located in Bad Axe, has approximately 150 employees. The HISD campus is well maintained and provides the necessary facilities to assure a state-of-the-art learning environment. The HISD Huron Learning Center and Transition House serve special education students ages 3-26 with significant disabilities. HISD special services provide trained staff and financial assistance to all local K-12 and K-8 Huron County schools. The Huron Area Technical Center provides a leading-edge career technical education to more than 400 students from local K-12 districts. HATC, in cooperation with Mid-Michigan College, offers dual enrollment to juniors and seniors from local K-12 schools to obtain college credit. The HISD administrative offices provide Business Services, Technology Services, Early Childhood and General Education staff, as well as itinerant staff who serve in local schools throughout the county. HISD has an annual budget of approximately \$20 million which, through the support of local taxpayers and sound financial planning, allows HISD to maintain a high level of services to the students of Huron County. HISD has charter millages in general education, special education and CTE totaling 4.88860 mills.

Huron County is located in Michigan's "Thumb" and is surrounded by more than 93 miles of scenic shoreline. The open waters of Saginaw Bay and Lake Huron provide year-round entertainment opportunities for the county's 32,000 residents and tourists alike. The sandy beaches of Caseville and the beautiful harbors of Port Austin and Harbor Beach draw people from all over the country. With more than 800 square miles of prime agricultural land, Huron County is one of the most prosperous agricultural areas in the state.
