The Delta-Schoolcraft Intermediate School District office is in Escanaba, Michigan which is situated along the Bays de Noc in the central Upper Peninsula and also services Schoolcraft County. Escanaba is located on US 2 and M-35, approximately 2.5 hours west of the Mackinac Bridge and 2 hours Northeast of Green Bay, WI. The area is largely rural/agricultural with a solid business and industrial presence. The Delta-Schoolcraft Intermediate School District serves the school districts of Bark River Harris, Big Bay de Noc, Escanaba, Gladstone, Manistique, Mid-Peninsula, Rapid River and Nah Tah Wahsh PSA. In all, about 5,969 students in local districts are served. The ISD operates the Delta-Schoolcraft ISD Career Tech Center and a satellite center in Manistique, the Learning Center (a facility for students with moderate to severe impairments) and is an operating partner for the Clear Lake Education Center (outdoor learning). In addition, the Delta-Schoolcraft Intermediate School District offers Early Education programs across both counties. The district maintains strong partnerships with the 6 other Upper Peninsula ISDs and Bay College.
